Full Moon Ritual for releasing the old.

Water has cleansing properties so one of the best things to do release stagnant energies is to either take a Full Moon shower. But before your shower, find a quiet and peaceful place where you can see the moon (if the sky is cloudy just imagine the full moon) out in nature is good, but a place with a window works just as well. Start by speaking a prayer of gratitude for the Divine. Follow it by thanking the moon for teaching you about cycles- the ebb and flow of life. Ask the moon to help you as you let go of the old to make room for the new.

Once you have done that it is time for getting the help of water to flush any negativity. When the water is running go under it and imagine it is washing away any old energies, thoughts that are constricting you and habits that are hampering you. By the end of your shower you should feel refreshed and calm. Make sure to drink some water or tea and as you do, picture abundance, joy, health, and fun flowing in through the liquid you are drinking.
